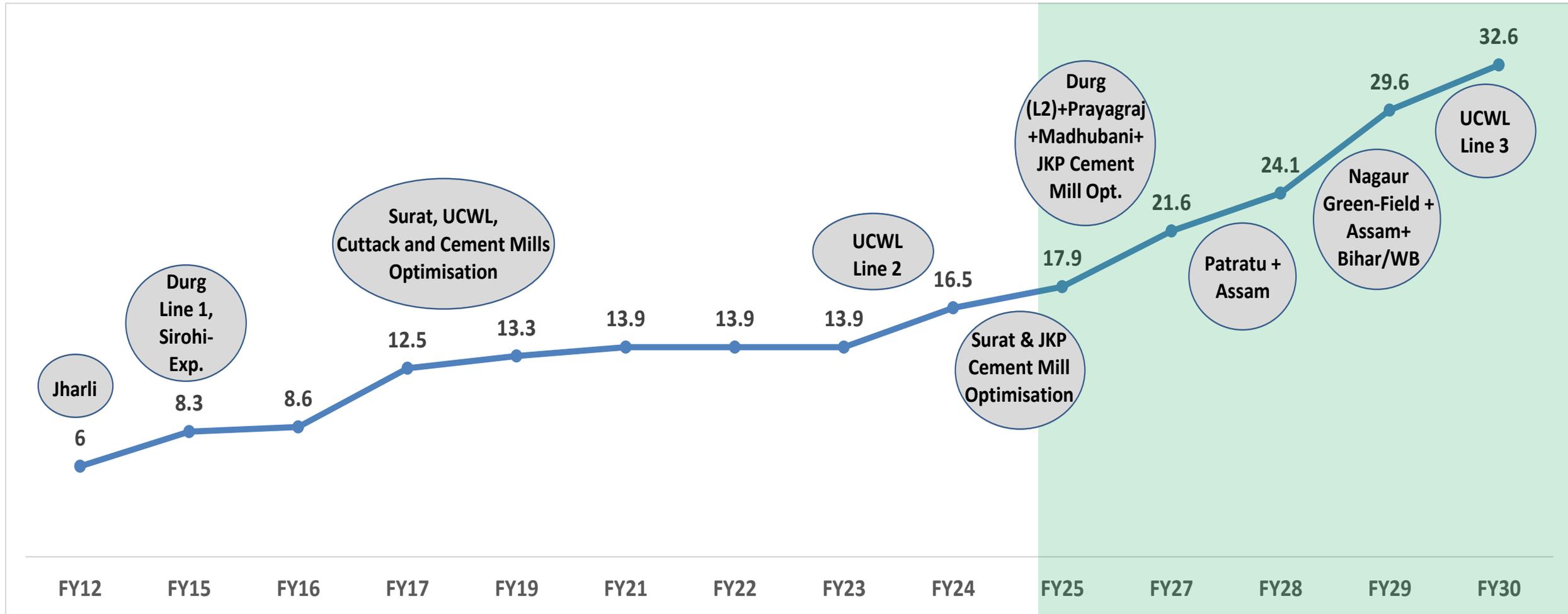

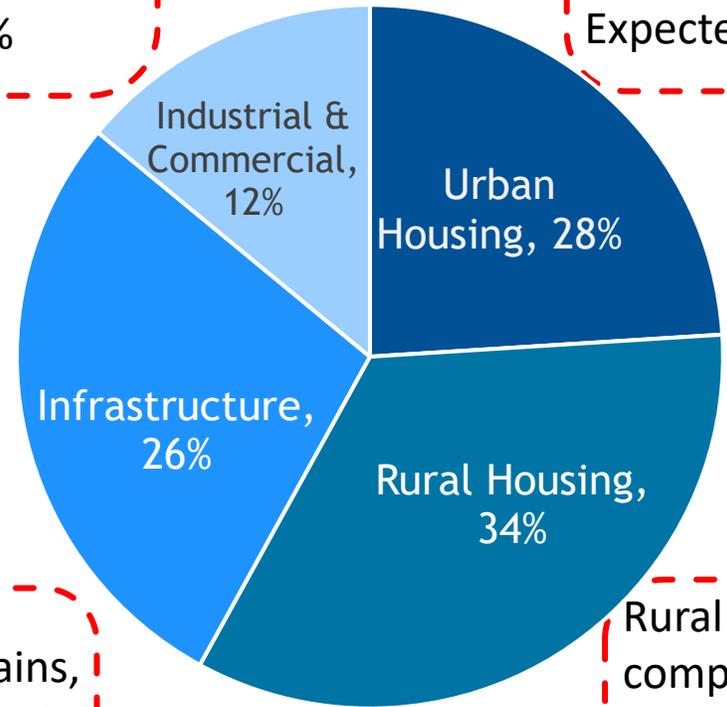

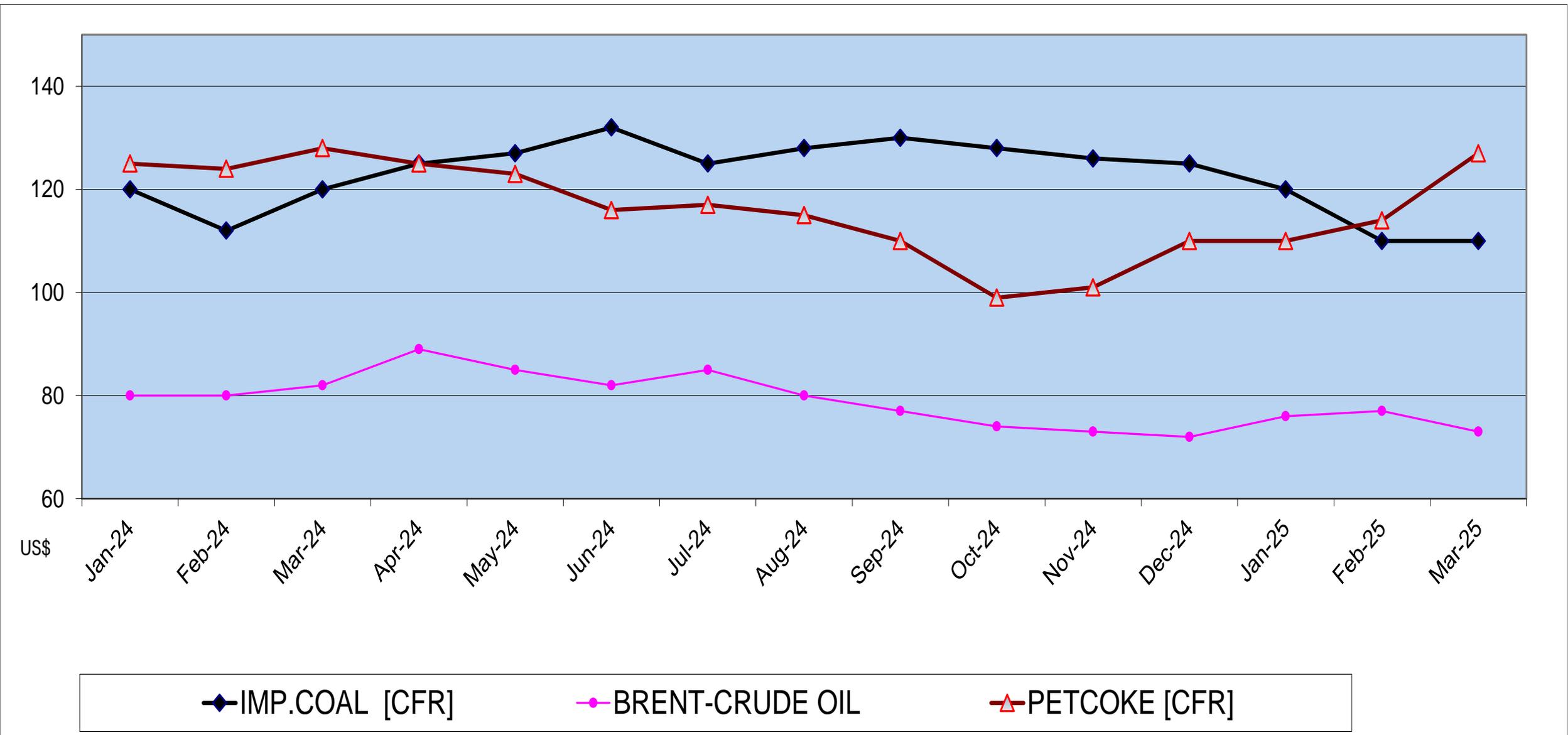

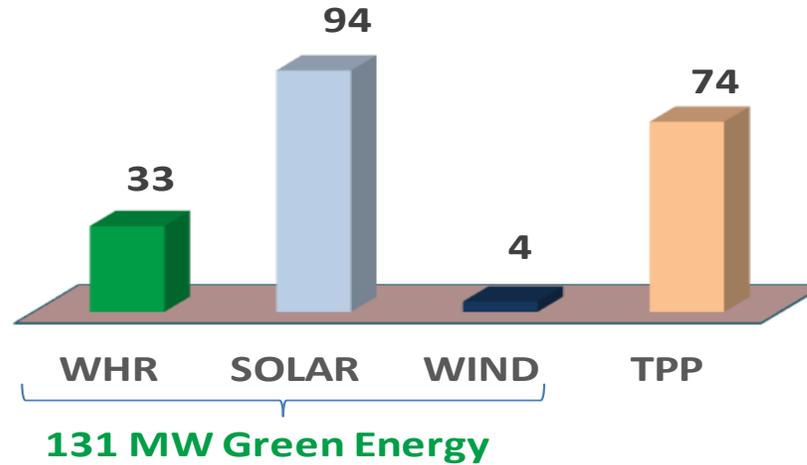

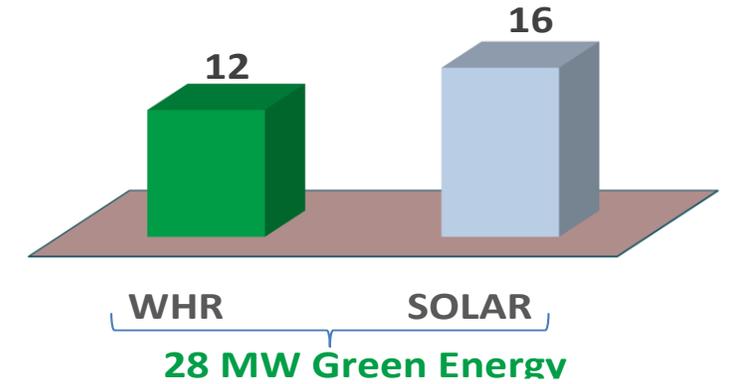


Share of Renewable Energy in Total Installed Captive Power Capacity (MW) at JK Lakshmi Cement and UCWL

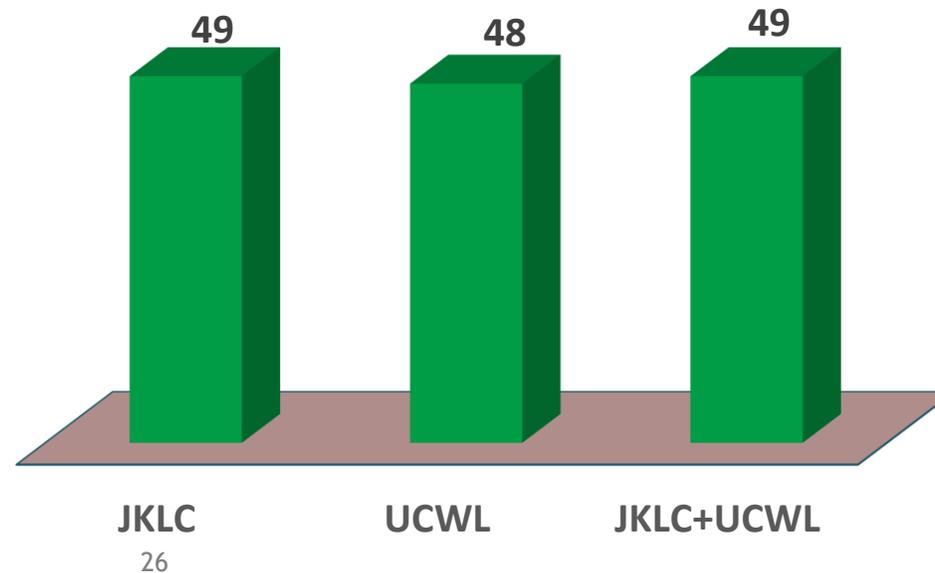

Share of Green Energy in Total Power Requirement (%)



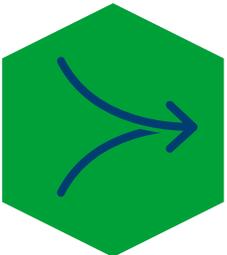
